Water bottles and Laces

Several children in Key Stage 1 are coming into school on their PE days in shoes with laces. If this is the case with your child, then they should be able to do them up themselves. As the weather turns the children will be required to change their shoes before going out to play at playtime and lunchtimes, and then back again as we come into the classroom and if they are unable to do their own laces this not only affects their ability to be independent but also reduces the time that they have outside. Additionally, staff do not have the time to repeatedly be doing up children's laces and undone laces can be an accident waiting to happen.

Can I also remind you that your child's water bottle should ideally have a sports style lid NOT a lid that they unscrew as this is resulting in a lot of spillages around school.

Harvest Festival

It is that time of year again. This year our Harvest festival will take place in St John's Church on Monday 11th October starting at 1:30pm. Those of you who can remember the 'olden' pre Covid days will recall that it can be a bit of a squeeze in the Church. So, this year, we are going to limit the number of adults that can attend to one ticket per family (vulnerable/younger family members are also welcome). We feel that these are useful skills for our children to become well-rounded adults in the future and staff are working hard to integrate these skills in to all areas of the curriculum.

This newsletters focus is Independence mainly because over the last few weeks there has been numerous messages in dairies, on WEDUC etc asking about a 'child's lost lunch box, jumper, fleece, water bottle, coat' etc which is taking up a lot of staff's time:

Independence in school, regardless of age, is a key part of development.

Independence in school comes in a variety of forms:

- children carrying their own bags to and from school
- being able to take off and put on own clothing and shoes – we understand that some of our little ones may struggle with this and will offer support when we see children struggling but we do expect children try themselves before asking for help – having jumpers etc that a slightly bigger does make it easier for them to remove their own clothes when needed
- managing their own belongings, making sure they are always in the right place and trying to find them themselves when things are lost – although some children are keen to do the 'smell' test to find their belongings, having names on items, takes very little effort and is a really big help.
- Being independent in their work – by ensuring they have listened to the instructions in the lesson, asking questions if they are unsure and taking time to think when things are tricky rather than assuming they can't do it.

Independence at home can be:

- Ensuring your child dresses and undresses themselves
- Show them where their name is on their clothing so they know how and where to check if things are theirs
- Allowing them to pack their own bags and hand letters and notes in by themselves to their class teacher
- Making their own bed
- Cutting up their own food using a knife and fork
- Tidying toys etc away by themselves
- Looking for their own things when they are lost

Term Dates 2022-23

The Local Authority have finally released the term dates right up until the end of 2027. As a school we still need to agree the INSET days which are days where staff but not children are expected to be in school.
