Play Fighting

In a busy environment it often leads to accidents, misunderstandings, or even intentional/unintentional harm. What starts as fun, can quickly end in tears.

That's why we remind ourselves of our mantra: "Is my fun, fun for everyone?" If the answer is no, it's time to choose a different way to play that keeps everyone safe, happy, and included. Your support with talking to your child/ren about this would be very much appreciated.

Harvest Festival

It is not long now to our Harvest Festival, September always seems to whizz by!

This year our Harvest festival will take place in St John's Church on Tuesday 14th October starting at 1:30pm. All parents/carers are more than welcome to join us. As we have done in previous years, we are asking for donations for local foodbanks who are in particular need of tinned soup, chickpeas, red kidney beans, baked beans, tinned meat (such as chilli, meatballs, stew, chicken in sauce), potatoes, carrots, sweetcorn, fruit, tuna, pulses, spaghetti – especially hoops/sponge and rice puddings; tins, cartons or packets of custard; instant mash potatoes, noodles, cuppa soups etc.; jars of pasta, curry sauce, jam; dried pasta, rice; breakfast cereal; tea, coffee, UHT long life milk, bottles of squash and fruit juices; sweet treats – penguins/kit-kats etc., as well as toothpaste, shampoo, deodorant, bars of soap, shaving foam and razors – NO alcohol please and please ensure all food is unopened and in date (it isn't always).

Members of the PTA will also be organising fruit and veg hamper raffle (again fresh fruit, vegetable and preserve donations are very much appreciated). Members of the PTA then make up 'themed' hampers – such as all you your need to make a chilli, sausage casserole, fajitas etc. Teas and coffees will be available in the school hall after the service for all to attend and the fruit and veg raffle will be drawn before the end of the school day. Gardening Club will also be holding a pumpkin raffle – well one large orange pumpkin, small orange pumpkin and two winter squash, that they have grown themselves, raffle. Raffle tickets will be for sale on the Monday 13th October on the playground and outside the church. Donations for the hampers need to be taken into the classroom by the children on Tuesday 14th October.

All donations will be split equally between Feed the Need in Coalville and the Ashby Foodbank. Every year, your generosity, at this time of year, blows me away we always have such a large amount of donations to hand over to both charities, who are every grateful for our support.

<u>Parking Reminders</u>
