



I can't fault anything my child has settled amazingly well.



We try to share as much as possible via WEDUC. Information that is on going can be found on Notices. Staff are unable to give daily feedback regarding individual children. Time after school is spend planning and preparing for future lessons etc. We will try to include more pictures during lessons when we can.

This is a tricky one – too much or too little. Following feedback from previous questionnaires we send out a questionnaire specifically about homework last year and took on board the feedback when devising our new policy. We are currently due to review this again in 2026.

Staff in school have many years teaching experience. We have found that the first year in school is quite tiring for children and adding activities on to the end of the day can have a detrimental effect particularly in the first term. We review clubs termly and dependent on what staff are able to offer, there may be appropriate clubs for EYFS in the summer term.
