New School Year Hints, Tips and Reminders!!

• Abor

- o All our communication is done through Arbor.
- o New families: by now you should have had an invite to log on.
- Arbor is pretty intuitive but if you need help, please ask and we will do our best to guide you.
- Any messages with attachments are emailed to you via Arbor. These can sometimes go in your junk - check your junk folder and amend your settings accordingly.
- All dates for the diary are also on the Arbor calendar as will be any clubs you sign your child up for.
- Please respond to payment and authorisation request promptly chasing parents for response is very time consuming.
- Check that all of yours and your child's details are correct, including mobile numbers, email addresses and postal addresses.
- o We need contact details of both parents, particularly for split families
- Check and read messages regularly to ensure you are up to date and your child does not miss out on events in school.

• School Dinners

- o School dinners cost £2.75 per day.
- Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to Universal Free School Meals (note: this is different to Free School Meals that are means tested according to income).
- We really do not enjoy chasing dinner money debt, so if your child is having a school lunches, please make sure their ARBOR meal account has sufficient funds.
- o If a dinner money debt goes above £20, then your child will not be allowed a school dinner and you will be asked to provide them with a packed lunch.
- o If your child brings in packed lunches, they are expected to take back home any uneaten food so that you can see what they have had for lunch.
- o Children are always strongly encouraged to eat more before going onto their pudding/leaving the table.

• Uniform

- o Please make sure all uniform is labelled with your child's name.
- Nail varnish and temporary tattoos are not part of our school uniform and should be removed.
- o Earrings should be of the small stud variety only no bracelets or necklaces
- Caps are required daily and must be worn if the temperature rises above 23 degrees – remember - 'no hattie, no play-outsidie'
- All children will require change of shoes for play time an lunch times either wellies or old trainers/school shoes

Dropping off and picking up

- Children are not to play on the Hex Climber or the trim trail. All children know this. They also know if they are seen on the equipment they will lose their playtime either that day or the following day.
- If your child comes to school on a bike/scooter they are expected to push it in when in the school grounds, not ride on it – this includes any pre-school aged children.
- o Parents of children in Caterpillar and Ladybird classes, please position yourselves in a place where staff can see you clearly as they open the class gate.
- Please make sure staff are aware if it someone different picking up the child other than yourself. In such rare cases when school have not been informed we will keep hold of your child until we are able to contact you to confirm the arrangements.

Please remember for PE days your child/ren will need to have a full PE kit, in a bag, in school. This should include

- black shorts/trackie bottoms/running tights (<u>please avoid casual leggings, they are not suitable for PE</u>)
- black school PE T-shirt,
- jumper preferably a school hoodie,
- trainers.

PE takes place outdoors regardless of the weather, so as we move further into the Autumn term – trackies and a hoodie are essential to keep your child warm and comfortable.

Please see below for our PE timetable for the first Autumn term.

As always, if you are sending your child/ren into school wearing PE trainers with laces, they are expected to be able to tie them – even when they are in KS1. If your child struggles with this, can I please politely ask that you invest time to teach them how to tie their laces – it is really not our job to do it and untied laces are just an accident waiting to happen. Very reasonably priced children's trainers with Velcro fastenings can also be purchased from Tesco (and other supermarket retailers or Sports Direct) if your child is finding tying shoe laces challenging.

We ask that PE kits stay in school all week — or even better, for the whole half term. That way, children are always ready for PE, even if we have to make a last-minute change to the timetable.

<u>First Aid – Bumped Head</u>

To help keep our children safe and ensure clear communication between staff, parents, and carers, we've introduced bright, festival-style "I've Bumped My Head" bracelets. These fun but important wristbands are given to any child who has had a minor bump to the head during the school day. Wearing the bracelet acts as a visible reminder for everyone—including teachers, playground staff, and families—that a bump has occurred. We will still continue to complete red slips too! The bracelet helps us monitor the child more closely throughout the day and ensures that parents are aware, even if the child forgets to mention it at home or the red slip is forgotten. Please keep an eye out for the bracelet and speak with your child's teacher if you have any questions.

MASH - Before and After School Club

Please note the current charges for MASH as per the previous newsletter. If you are booking MASH beyond the 2pm cut off on the previous day, you will now need to select either AFTER CUT OFF (2pm previous day) Breakfast Club or AFTER CUT OFF (2pm previous day) After school Club and pay the flat rate. There are 2 options under the latter, one price for Mon-Thurs and one for Fridays as it finishes an hour earlier.

If you are booking MASH before the cut off time (2pm the day before), then nothing has changed and you can select the usual options for booking – MASH (Before School) 25/26 and MASH (After School) 25/26.
